The number of sightings of North Pacific humpback whales (座头鲸) went into a huge drop in their traditional breeding (繁殖) grounds off Hawaii this year. Although fewer sightings don't necessarily mean the whales are dying off, or that they're not still migrating to the islands, the disappearance of many whales from this historically predictable location is drawing attention.

Some researchers believe there's a link between warmer sea temperatures in Alaska and the influence that has on the whales' food chain. The drop in sightings is about

50% to 80% over the past four years. Most humpbacks were taken off the endangered species list in 2016 but are still protected by the US government.

Although scientists say it's too early to draw any conclusion, the drop has sparked enough interest that a group of whale experts are meeting in Honolulu, Hawaii, to compare data and try to better understand what is happening and what to do about it.

The humpbacks traditionally migrate each autumn from Alaska to Hawaii, where they mate and give birth during the winter. In the spring, they head to Alaska, where they feed during the summer months.

Marc Lammers, research coordinator for Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary, said research groups have collected different data sets that all seem to point toward decreased whale sightings.

"People started to report fewer sightings, and there were worries about what might be going on," Lammers said in a telephone interview.

"We just know that we're not seeing them in the same places that we're expecting to see them," he said.

"Many reasons are being considered including the possibility that warmer sea temperatures are reducing food supplies in the north," said Rachel Cartwright, lead researcher at Keiki Kohola Project. "If the female whales are not getting enough food, they will be unable to reproduce."

Cartwright said she doesn't believe the whales are in danger of becoming greatly reduced again but thinks it's important to understand the connection between environmental and climate changes in Alaska and the whales' behavior.

The 2020 Tokyo Olympics organizing committee planned to allow up to 5,000 people to watch the sailing events off Enoshima just south of the Japanese capital. They lowered the number to 3,300, however, after discussing with local experts the measures for evacuating(疏散) audiences if a tsunami occurs, according to the public broadcaster NHK.

Japan is one of the most seismically active(地震活跃的) countries in the world. Its Pacific coast, where the sailing events will take place, is easily influenced by powerful tsunamis caused by earthquakes. In less than two months, time, the country will mark the eighth anniversary of the March 2011 disaster, in which over ten thousand people were killed by a huge tsunami along the northeast coast.

While there is disagreement on the likelihood of Tokyo being struck by a destructive earthquake in the foreseeable future, experts believe there is a high probability of a major earthquake occurring in Tokyo's urban area within the next 30 years. A powerful offshore quake could cause a large tsunami that would reach the shore within minutes, according to the government's predictions.

The decision to cut the number of audiences at Enoshima is not the only adjustment organisers of the Olympics, which will run from 24 July to 9 August 2020, have had to make in view of Japan's vulnerability(易受伤害) to powerful natural forces and extreme weather.

The Yomiuri Shimbun reported last week that organisers had decided to change the start time for the men's and women's marathons to 6:00 am—an hour and a half earlier than originally planned—to avoid the health risks to runners and audiences caused by the heat later in the day. Tjjc men's 50 kilometre race walk will start two hours earlier, at 5:30 am., the newspaper said, according to sources close to the Games.

In July last year, a record 133 people died from heatstroke or heat exhaustion in Japan, with thousands of others admitted to hospital. The country experienced its

highest temperature on record on 23 July, when the temperature reached 41.1°C in Kumagaya, a city northwest of Tokyo. Several other cities recorded temperatures of about 40°C.

For years Juli dreamed of one thing: her first kiss from the boy. Nothing else seemed to matter. But when Mi's favorite sycamore tree is threatened by developers things begin to change. She begins to see things and places and people in a different light. Things for years, she thought to be important, become things she can live without; and people she thought to be the center of her universe, become nothing more than a star in a faraway galaxy.

Things began change with Bryce also. It all begins with the eggs...which then cause a domino effect of change with his relationship with his best friend, his father, the Bakers and, ultimately, Juli.

I had seen this book on the shelf at bookstore for years, but never bother to pick it up because it looked to be another book from Jerry Spinelli (not exactly my favorite author in the world) and so, continually, I would walk past it without giving it a second glance. If by chance I had picked it up, I most likely would not have read it, since the summary on the back didn't seem too appealing. It wasn't until a couple of weeks ago that I heard about Flipped the movie. I read an interview with Callan McAuliffe (the actor who portrays Bryce) and thought that Flipped was a romance right up my alley; cute, innocent and as far from Jane Austin as you could get. After reading the interview and a summary of the movie. I found the plot-line to be somewhat appealing and a definite breath of fresh air opposed to the dark material have been recently reading and writing. I found the book a few days later in a Goodwill bookstore and finished it in three days.

The story isn't what you would consider deep...it isn't shallow and pointless either...I guess you could say it's the perfect balance of life-lessons and innocence.

You read about Bryce and Juli (each from their own points of view) and how, throughout six years, their lives and views and opinions change and develop. Flipped is somewhat of a coming of age story about two kids learning to see life from the other's point of view and learning that growing up isn't about staying the same, but changing; changing likes and dislikes; changing friends and crushes and views on family.

Uniquely written, every other chapter showing the same scenes and events, only from the other's point of view, you see how the saying, "Two sides to every story," is true. You are able to see both Juli and Bryce's reasons for doing what they do and saying what they say...not just what the other sees.

It will be interesting to see how this writing style comes into play in the movie. Overall I thought this story was incredibly cute and light-hearted, although it didn't entirely meet my expectations. Especially the ending. I felt as though it ended quite abruptly and that there was more story that needed to be told.

But even with that, after having taken a step back and taken my mind off of Flipped, I find the story has stuck with me and stayed in the back of my mind, making me highly anticipate seeing this book turned to a film. I understand why it has been so popular for almost two decades and am looking forward to seeing Flipped on the big screen soon.

Another common type is platonic (柏拉图的) jealousy which can be most commonly in friendships, when one fears losing a friend to a more interesting or friendly person. The emotional attachment with your own friend is so much that you can' t imagine them with someone else.

Sibling jealousy, commonly seen in families across the world, is also one common

type of jealousy. There is a general sense of competition among children to be their parents' favourite child. Often there is a display of jealousy on the arrival of a new sibling when you are made to share favorite toys, clothes, or other facilities, receive less attention, or even experience a negative comparison between siblings.

Jealousy isn't a good thing and fortunately, it's possible to gradually control it. This requires initiative (决断) and full support from the person facing the problem as well as his loved ones. 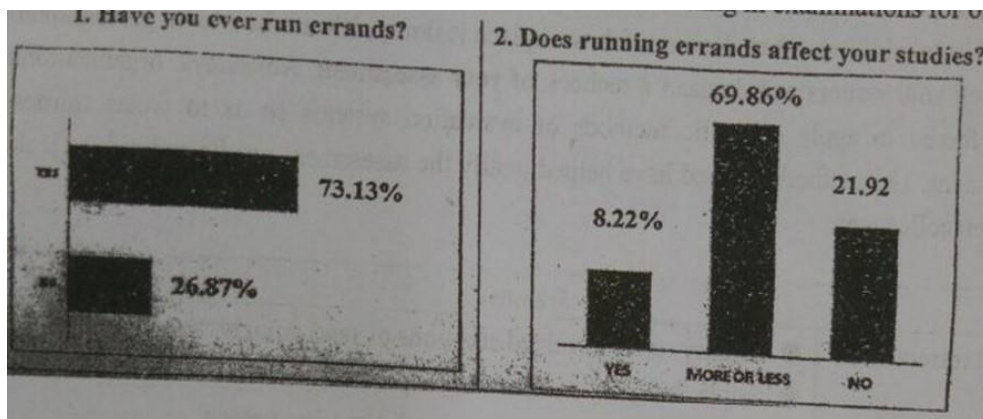

#### (Approval)

I subscribe to the idea of running errands for money for the following reasons: for one thing, despite the scholarship and financial assistance programs offered at universities, to those facing financial pressures, running errands may help them with their studies to some extent. For another thing, students are expected to further understand the service industry and sharpen their working skills, better preparing themselves for their future career in the long term.

The above reasons taken into consideration, we may safely conclude that not only does running errands bring us economic benefits, but it contributes to cultivating our interpersonal and social skills. Therefore, I am in complete agreement with this practice.
